The new curriculum is more difficult than the old but the staff and children have risen to the challenge and are enjoying the new topics.

Site Improvements

The schools have had many exciting new improvement this term. We now have new Junior playground equipment, a picket fence between the two schools on the Junior lower playground and a recently refurbished Junior library opened by His Worshipful Mayor of Barnet. The ramps to the Junior huts are now completed, and the new swimming pool changing rooms are greatly appreciated by all the children. The Infants have installed new Interactive Whiteboards in some classrooms with plans to install a further 5 when funding is secured. Over the summer a new Inclusion room will be built for our new Infant Inclusion Leader (SENCO).
