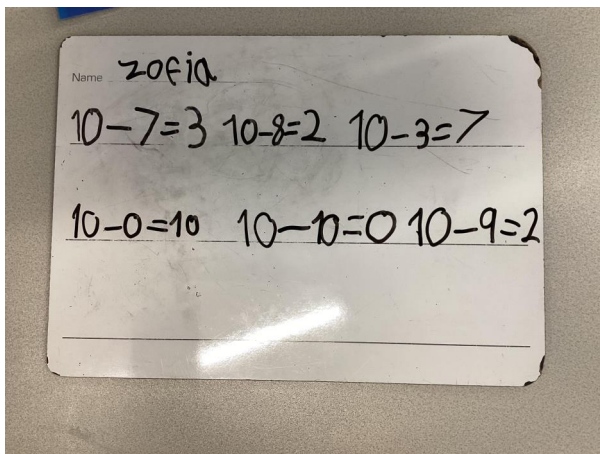




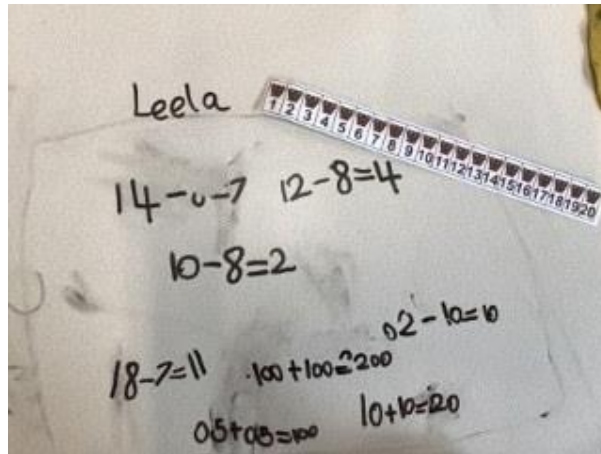
We discussed how to stay safe online by making sure we always ask an adult we can trust to play or watch something online. If I see something I don't like, I must tell my trusted adult who will help me.

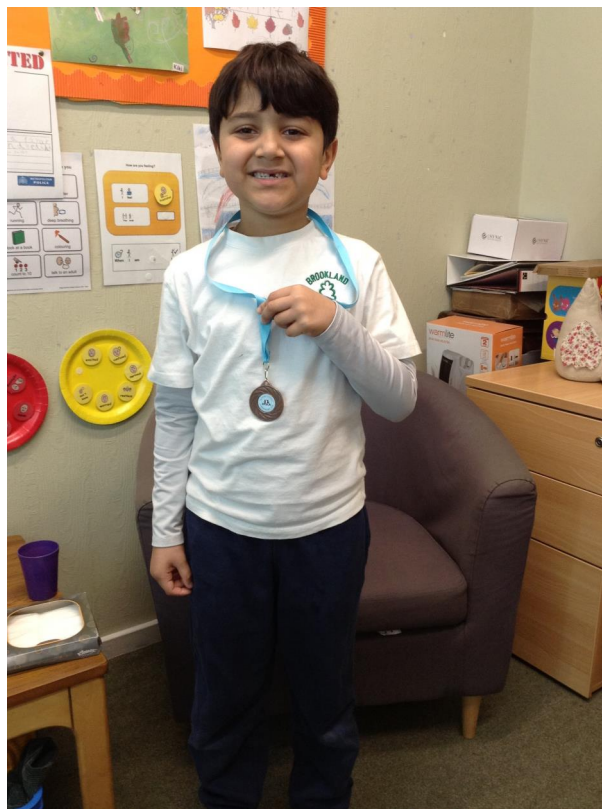


## Bear Class Assembly

We are extremely proud of Musa (Giraffe class) for demonstrating our school values both in and beyond the classroom.

On Sunday 8th February, Musa represented Brookland Infant School at the National Primary School Chess Championship 2026 as part of the Juniors team. He thoroughly enjoyed the event and played exceptionally well.

The team achieved an impressive 3rd place, earning a bronze medal. Notably, Musa was the only Year 2 pupil in the entire tournament and showed remarkable confidence, resilience and determination throughout the competition.

Mr Fleetwood, the chess coach and everyone at Brookland Infant and Nursery School are incredibly proud of Musa's achievement.

## Safer Internet Day



The children had a fantastic time celebrating Safer Internet Day on Tuesday. This year's theme focused on using AI safely, and children across the school took part in a range of engaging activities.

All children from Reception to Year 2 attended a Safer Internet Day assembly led by Mrs Bradley and her special guest, "Alexa" – a very convincing AI robot brought to life by the amazing Miss Delany! The children explored fun and safe ways to use AI and even created their own AI-generated colouring sheets.

In Reception, children discussed trusted adults and thought carefully about who they could talk to if something made them feel “funny in their tummy”. Key Stage 1 took part in a lesson all about AI and how it is used, challenging themselves to decide whether images were real photographs or AI-generated. Nursery children enjoyed the story *Smartie the Penguin* and talked about how he could make safe choices when using technology.

There was lots of enthusiastic discussion about apps, gaming, favourite YouTube channels and smart speakers at home. Most importantly, it was clear that our children from Nursery through to Year 2 feel confident telling a trusted adult if they need help and are already able to identify some key online risks.

## Children's Mental Health Week



This year, *Children's Mental Health Week* focused on the theme “***This is my place***”, helping children understand the importance of belonging. We talked about how our special people and trusted adults help us feel safe, happy, and valued. The children learned that trusted adults can support us, listen to us, and help us feel confident to be ourselves.

Through PSHE activities and in Assembly, we explored what it means to belong, as a person, as a member of our class, and as part of our school community. We shared ideas about kindness, friendship, and how working together helps everyone feel included. By supporting one another, we can make sure that every child feels able to say, “This is my place.”

We are really looking forward to learning even more about the different countries and cultures that make up our Brookland community.

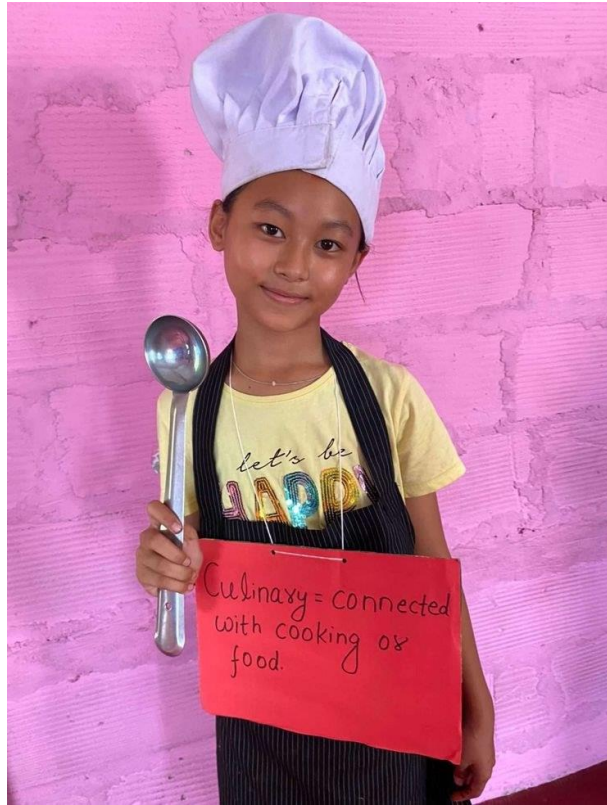
## World Book Day



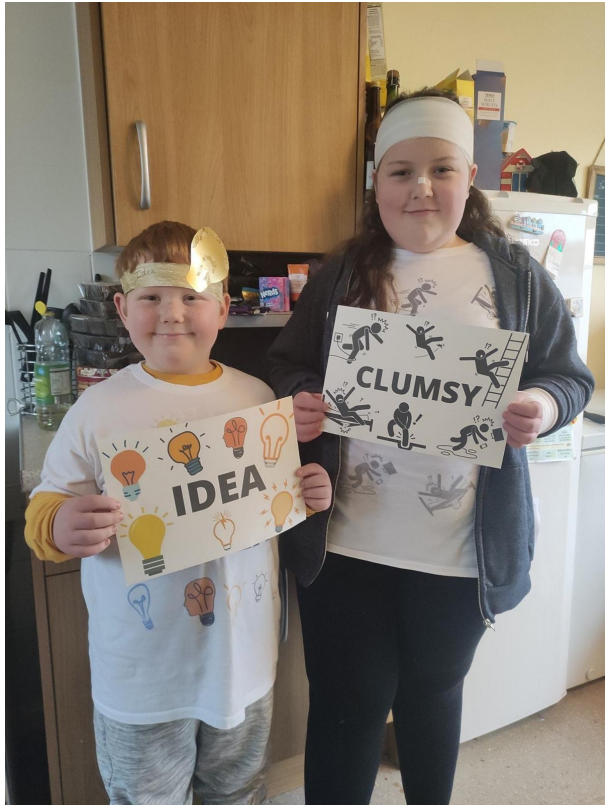

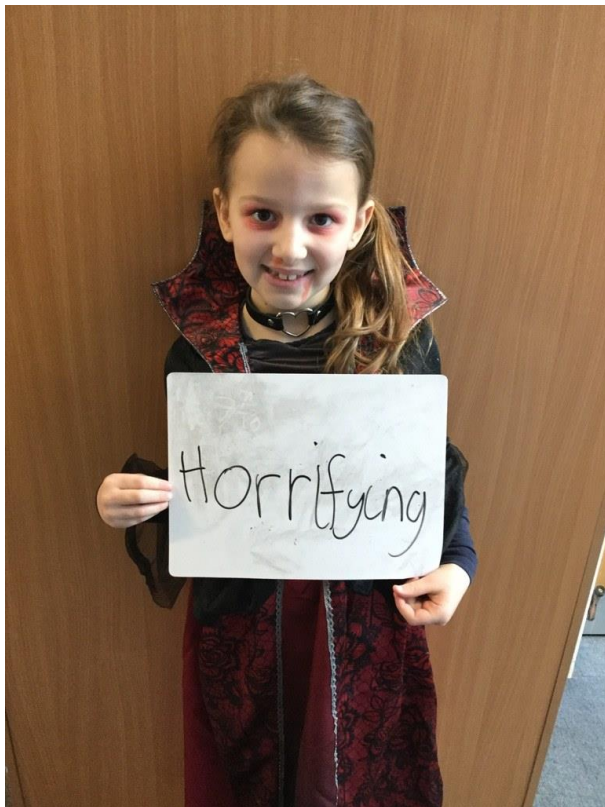




- We expect a child's attendance to be maintained at *95%* or above for the school year.

Barnet Council is offering free child car seat safety checks to ensure children are travelling safely. A trained expert from Good Egg Safety will be available to **inspect seats, fix errors and provide advice**, no booking required.

A check can be made on your child car seat even if your child isn't with you — but if they are, we can also check they are seated correctly and safely.

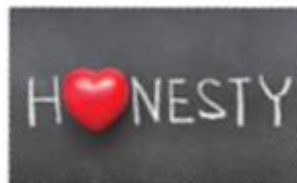
In response to the high turnout at previous events, **two** advisors will now be available on the day. To avoid unnecessary travel, you're welcome to call us on the day to check waiting times.

Last year, **92% of seats checked in Barnet had errors**, many serious enough to endanger children in the event of a collision. Unfortunately, errors on seats are very easily made, but the great news is that they tend to be easy to fix.

**Don't miss this opportunity to get peace of mind and help make Barnet's roads safer for everyone.**

### Nut-Free School (this also includes after school clubs)



We would like to remind all parents and carers that our school is strictly *nut free* in order to keep children with severe nut allergies safe. This includes items such as nuts, cashew nuts, hazelnuts, pistachios, peanut puffs, hazelnut spread biscuits or dip pots, and other products containing nuts, including pesto, Nutella and Bamba snacks.

While nut allergies are not airborne, there is a significant risk from traces left on hands, play equipment, or classroom surfaces, which could cause a serious reaction in children with allergies.

We also kindly ask that no nuts or nut-containing items are brought onto the school site at any time, including at pick-up. We have recently noticed children with nuts as a snack to be consumed during their afterschool club activities.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding in helping us keep every child safe.
