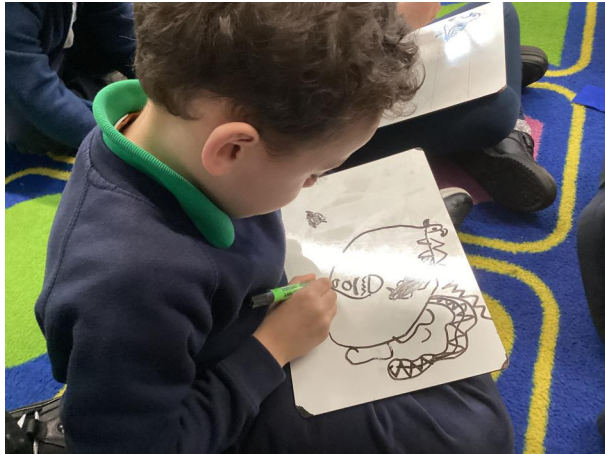














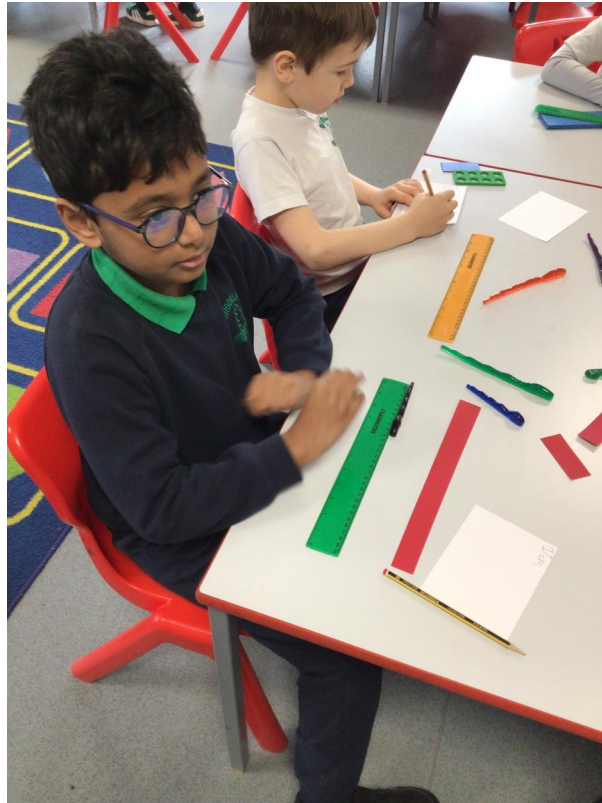












Y2 residential meeting

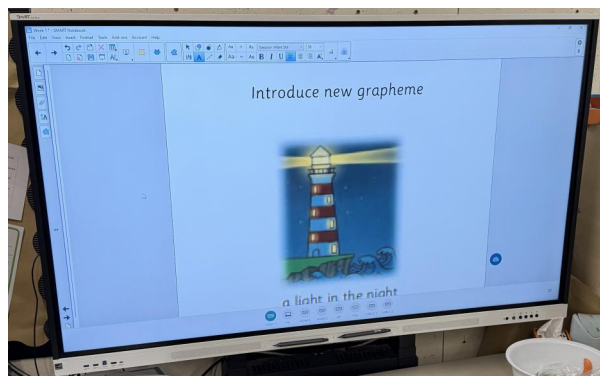
opportunity to speak with your child's class teacher about how they are getting on at school and to discuss their next steps in learning. We look forward to seeing you there.

Playdate pledge

As families with infants and young children, we know that little ones learn best through **simple, real-life play**: playing games together, building with blocks or LEGO, engaging in art and craft activities, exploring sensory materials, moving their bodies, and discovering how the world works through trial and error. At this age, children do not need screens to be entertained or connected.

A shared, screen-free playdate agreement can help take the pressure off parents and carers. When families are on the same page, those who choose to limit screens at home can feel confident that their child will have a similar experience during playdates elsewhere. It also helps create an environment where **no child feels left out and no adult feels uncomfortable about saying “no screens.”**

Participation in the Brookland Playdate Pledge is entirely voluntary and is intended to support, not judge, individual family choices.

Playdate Pledge:

We believe that young children learn best through hands-on, social play.

By supporting this pledge, we agree that during playdates for our children:

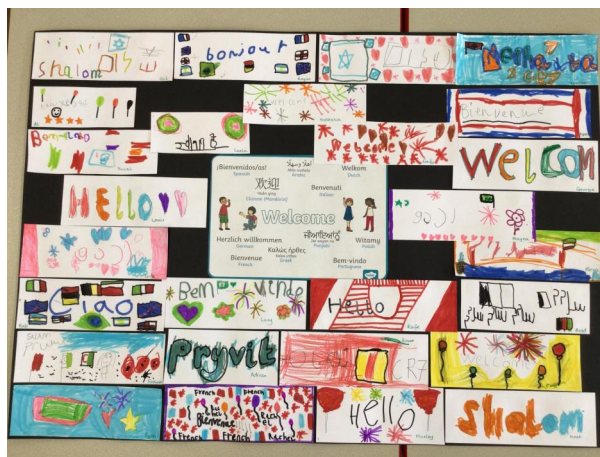
- Playdates will be **screen-free**, with no television, tablets, phones, or computers used for entertainment.
- Children will engage in **in-person play**, such as toys, books, music, movement, imaginative and creative activities.
- Social media platforms (including YouTube, TikTok, Instagram, or similar apps) will not be used around children during playdates.
- Adults will **model healthy technology habits** by limiting personal screen use during playtime.
- Our focus will be on **safe, joyful, and developmentally appropriate play**.

We understand that this pledge supports children’s **social, emotional, and cognitive development**, and helps build healthy habits from the very beginning. By working together, we strengthen our shared commitment to nurturing confident, creative, curious, ambitious and healthy children.

International Language Day

International Mother Language Day was on Saturday 21st February and we celebrated it at school yesterday. It was fantastic to see the children and staff wearing clothes and colours to represent the wide range of countries our families come from. Currently we have over 40 different languages as well as English spoken by staff and children across the school. The children had the opportunity to parade and show to each other and talk about their home country, they learnt how to say 'welcome' in different languages in their classrooms and have made 'Welcome' posters celebrating the different languages spoken in the class. Thank you to those parents who have volunteered to come in to class and read or

tell a story in your home language. If this is something that you would still like to do please speak to your child's class teacher.







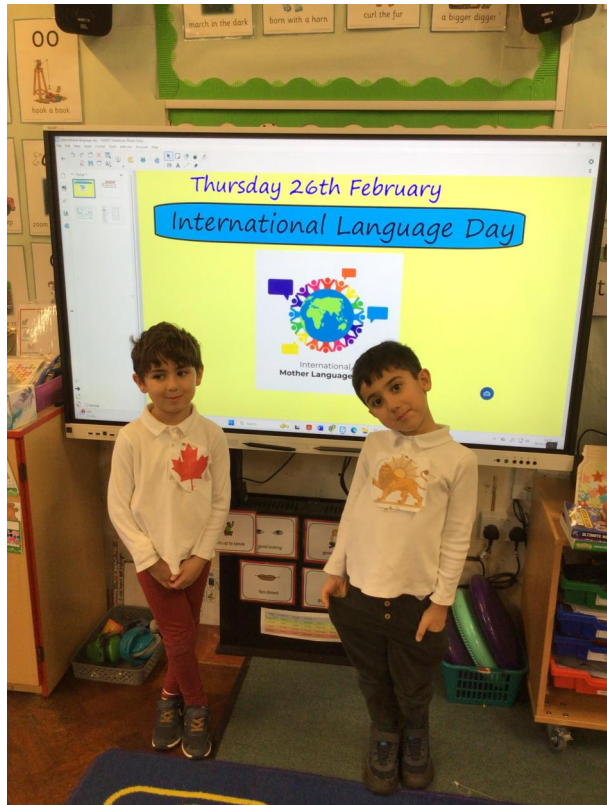


















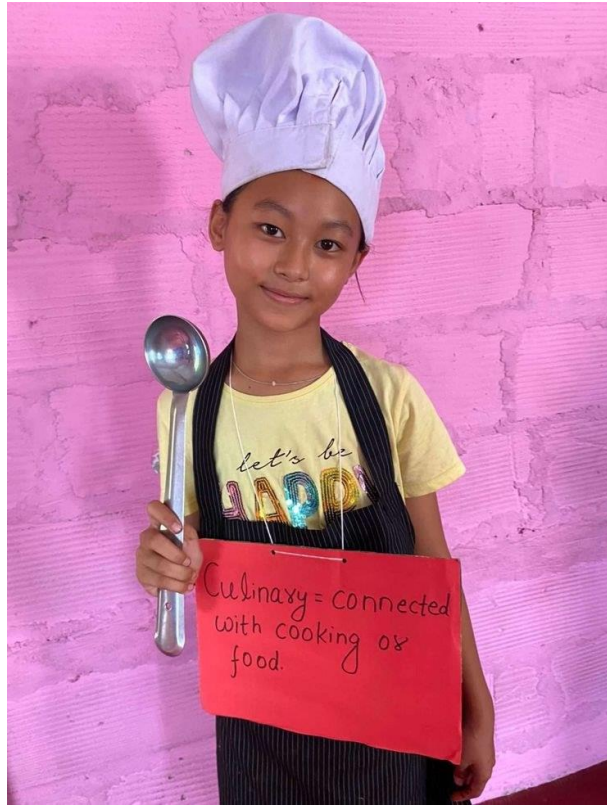
World Book Day

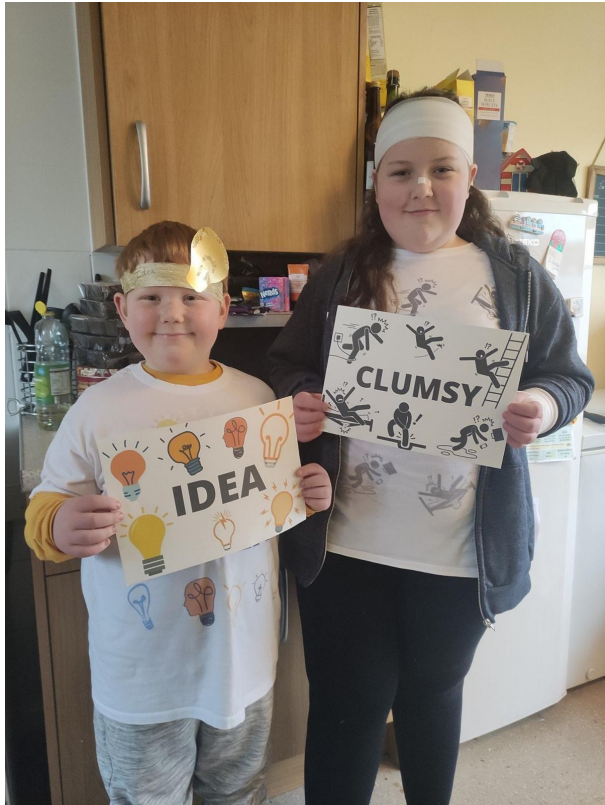

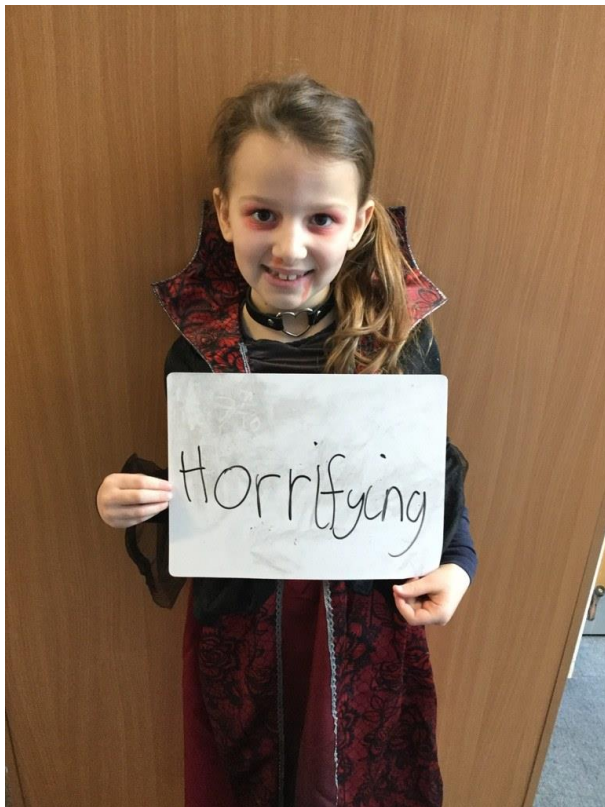

This summer term, we are excited to be organising a STEM Week themed “*The Power of Plants.*” Our aim is to inspire the children to explore the world of plants — learning about how they support us through food, conservation, medicine, and everyday products.

As part of the week, the children will also design and create a plant-based product to sell in order to raise funds for the school to buy some science resources.

We would love to involve members of our school community. If you have experience, knowledge, or connections related to plants, we would be delighted to hear from you.

Perhaps you are:

- A keen chef who could cook plant-based dishes with the children and discuss the benefits of different ingredients
- A botanist, gardener, herbalist, florist, homeopath, or someone who makes plant-based products
- Connected to someone in the community who would be happy to come in and inspire the children

We are looking for volunteers who would be willing to:

- Lead a workshop or activity
- Deliver an assembly
- Run a cooking session
- Teach a plant-based craft
- Share their time, skills, and expertise

We welcome any support during STEM Week and would love to hear your ideas.

In my role as Computing Leader, I will also be teaching Key Stage 1 children how to create stop-frame animations, and some pupils will be using iMovie to produce adverts promoting the power of plants. If anyone in our community works in animation, digital art, film, or media and would like to collaborate with us, that would be fantastic.

Additionally, we are seeking donations of plants and herbs, or volunteers who would be happy to help the children create a herb garden in the flower beds near the Year 2 building.

If you are interested in getting involved or have any suggestions, please contact Mrs Bradley in The Elephant Class. Our previous STEM Weeks (Bees, Chicks, Dinosaurs, and Robots) have been a great success, and we are looking forward to another engaging and inspiring week that helps children appreciate just how important plants are in our lives.

Barnet Council is offering free child car seat safety checks to ensure children are travelling safely. A trained expert from Good Egg Safety will be available to **inspect seats, fix errors and provide advice**, no booking required.

A check can be made on your child car seat even if your child isn't with you — but if they are, we can also check they are seated correctly and safely.

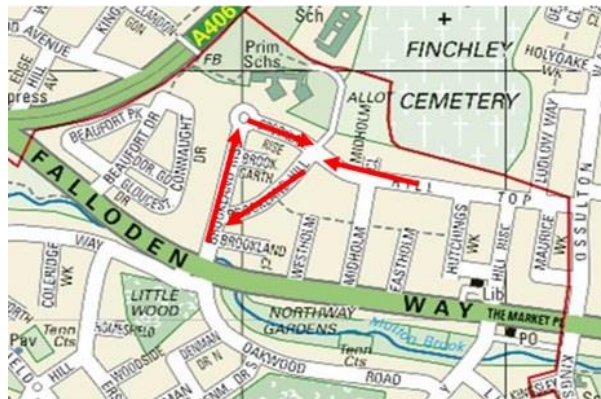
In response to the high turnout at previous events, **two** advisors will now be available on the day. To avoid unnecessary travel, you're welcome to call us on the day to check waiting times.

Last year, **92% of seats checked in Barnet had errors**, many serious enough to endanger children in the event of a collision. Unfortunately, errors on seats are very easily made, but the great news is that they tend to be easy to fix.



- We understand that children do often pick up illnesses such as colds, temperatures and other childhood illnesses so this may not always be possible. *When reporting your child's absence, please give us a brief explanation of what your child has so we can comply with public health and attendance guidelines.*
- If your child has an appointment (*hospital, dental, opticians, visa appointment etc*), we do ask that these be made during the half terms. We do understand this may not always be possible, but in any case, proof of the appointment must be provided (e.g screenshot of the reminder text/email, confirmation email/letter etc). If proof is not seen, the school cannot authorise the absence.
