Play Expert: Amira, for being kind and playing nice games with her friends.



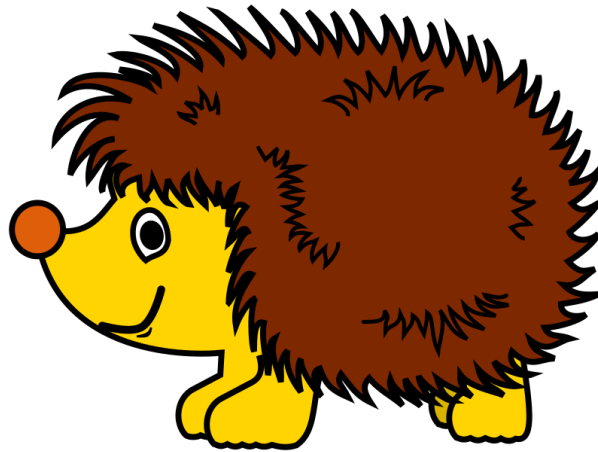
1. Noah, for his amazing English work. For trying hard to write independently and great phonics.

## Y2 Residential

Their dedication and commitment are greatly appreciated. ## Sports Day

We are aware that very hot weather is forecast for Monday. We will make a final decision on Sunday once we have the most up-to-date information; however, at present, it looks likely that the Year 1 and Year 2 event will go ahead as planned, starting at 9:15am, but with a shortened finish time of 10:30am to ensure everyone's safety and comfort.

To avoid the hottest part of the day, the Reception and Nursery event will be moved to the morning of our back-up date, Monday 13th July, from 9:15am to 10:15am.

If the event goes ahead on Monday, please ensure that your child comes to school with a full water bottle, wearing sun cream and a sun hat.

Thank you for your understanding and flexibility. Unfortunately, we have no control over the weather, but we will continue to monitor the forecast closely and will keep you updated.

## Oral Hygiene workshop

Today, Year 1 had a visit from the school nurses, who delivered an engaging session on oral hygiene. The children learned about the importance of keeping their teeth clean, how to brush their teeth correctly, and what germs are like. They were shown how the colour of their teeth can indicate whether they are clean or need more brushing. The children were keen to share what they had learned, explaining that teeth should be brushed for two minutes and that it is best not to drink water straight after brushing, as the toothpaste needs time to do its "superhero work" protecting their teeth. The children were very interested throughout the session and appeared fully engaged in their learning.

## STEM Week

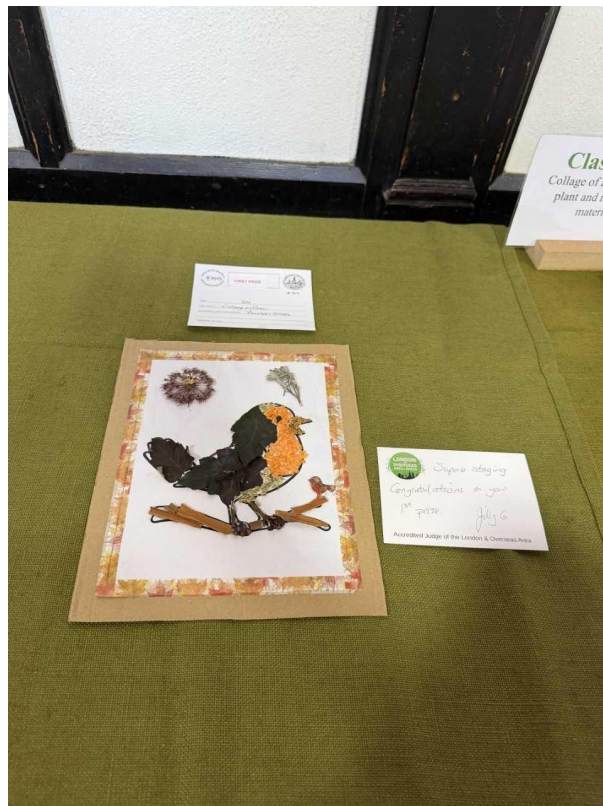
As part of our exciting STEM Week, themed "**The Power of Plants**," we have planned a range of engaging and inspiring activities for the children to enjoy. Throughout the week, children will take part in hands-on learning experiences designed to explore the fascinating world of plants and develop their scientific understanding in a fun and memorable way.

One of the highlights of the week will be a special Science workshop for Key Stage 1. Through interactive role-play and creative performance, the children will participate in the "**Powerful Plants**" educational drama workshop. The programme supports key National Curriculum science objectives, including learning about plant structures, identifying common garden plants, and understanding the conditions plants need to grow and thrive, all while having lots of fun!

The workshop will take place on Tuesday 23rd June, with each Year 1 and Year 2 class enjoying their own dedicated session.

To help cover the cost of the resources and materials purchased to support our STEM Week activities, we kindly ask for a voluntary contribution of **£2.50 per child**. Thank you for your continued support.

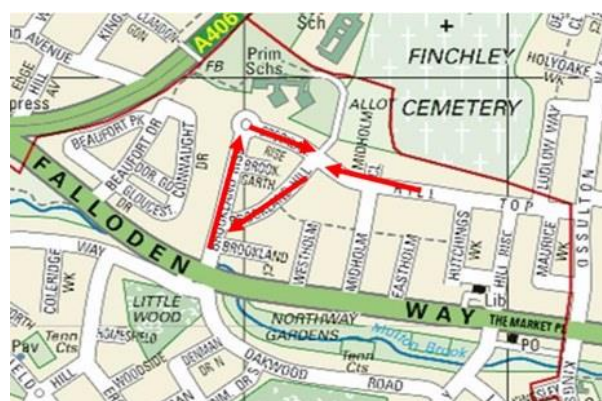

### Attendance - Expectations and Information

- We expect a child's attendance to be maintained at 96% or above for the school year.
- We understand that children do often pick up illnesses such as colds, temperatures and other childhood illnesses so this may not always be possible. *When reporting your child's absence, please give us a brief explanation of what your child has so we can comply with public health and attendance guidelines.*
- If your child has an appointment (*hospital, dental, opticians, visa appointment etc*), we do ask that these be made during the half terms. We do understand this may not always be possible, but in any case, proof of the appointment must be provided (e.g screenshot of the reminder text/email, confirmation email/letter etc). **If proof is not seen or provided, the school cannot authorise the absence.**
- **We will not be able to authorise absences/Leave of Absences on the first or last day of school terms but will take each case in to consideration. Please still complete a Leave of Absence requesting the time as each request will be looked at on their individual merits.**

### Nut-Free School (this also includes after school clubs)



We would like to remind all parents and carers that our school is strictly *nut free* in order to keep children with severe nut allergies safe. This includes items such as nuts, cashew nuts, hazelnuts, pistachios, peanut puffs, hazelnut spread biscuits or dip pots, and other products containing nuts, including pesto, Nutella and Bamba snacks.

While nut allergies are not airborne, there is a significant risk from traces left on hands, play equipment, or classroom surfaces, which could cause a serious reaction in children with allergies.

We also kindly ask that no nuts or nut-containing items are brought onto the school site at any time, including at pick-up. We have recently noticed children with nuts as a snack to be consumed during their afterschool club activities.

Thank you for your continued support and understanding in helping us keep every child safe.
