Dear Parents/Carers,

This week we have read 'The Tiger who came to Tea'. The children have enjoyed making tea in the outdoor classroom and exploring what happens when you mix tea bags with water as well as look at what tea leaves actually look like! There has been lots of exploratory play in the garden, with many a meal being made in the mud kitchen and sandpit for the tiger.
